

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Remove Existing Window

Option A: Screw-Type Window

1. Remove the 16 Phillips head screws from the interior window frame (Fig.1A).



2. Support the window glass on the interior side to prevent the glass from falling inward, causing it to pull away from the interior frame.

NOTE: A second person is recommended to assist during the removal of the interior frame.

3. Remove exterior frame and glass.

Option B: Snap-In Window

1. Slide the 16 release tools (Fig.2A) into the 16 slots (Fig.3) around the outside perimeter of the interior window frame.





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NOTE: There are grooves on the bottom of the release tools that fit into the ribs of the frame, allowing the tool to open the frame's catch feature (Fig.4).



2. Support the window glass on the interior side to prevent the glass from falling inward, causing it to pull away the interior frame.

NOTE: A second person is recommended to assist during the removal of the interior and exterior frame.

- 3. Remove exterior frame and glass.
- **4.** Remove release tools from interior frame.

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Install New Window

1. Place the new outer frame with glass against the exterior of the door (Fig.5).



NOTE: Make sure the frame's seal is positioned properly against the door.

NOTE: The next step will require another person to assist while preparing to install the interior frame.

- **2.** While one person holds the exterior frame and glass against the door, the other person snaps the interior frame into the exterior frame. Make sure all 16 locking points click into place.
- **3.** Hold a wood block on one side of the frame and tap the other side with a rubber mallet. The gap between the frame and door will close when the seal is completely compressed and the exterior frame touches the door.
- **4.** Continue tapping the frame around its perimeter until all 16 points are fully locked.

Install Thin Shade

1. Unlatch the small levers at the top of the window frame in a left-to-right direction (**Fig.6**).



2. Unlatch the levers at the bottom of the frame in a right-to-left direction (Fig.6).

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3. Holding the top rail of the Thin Shade at an approximate 45-degree angle, insert one end of the rail into the corner between the inner frame and glass (**Fig.7A**).

NOTE: Shade portion not shown for clarity.

- 4. Repeat this action on the opposite end of the top rail.
- **5.** Press both ends of the rail up and latch in-place, moving the top levers (Fig.6) in a right-to-left direction.
- **6.** Holding the bottom rail at an approximate 45-degree angle, insert one end into the corner between the inner and outer frame (Fig.7B).
- 7. Repeat this action on the opposite end of the bottom rail.
- **8.** Press both ends of the rail down and latch in-place, moving the bottom levers in a left-to-right direction.



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
